



Frank Lloyd Wright Inspired Design Woodburning

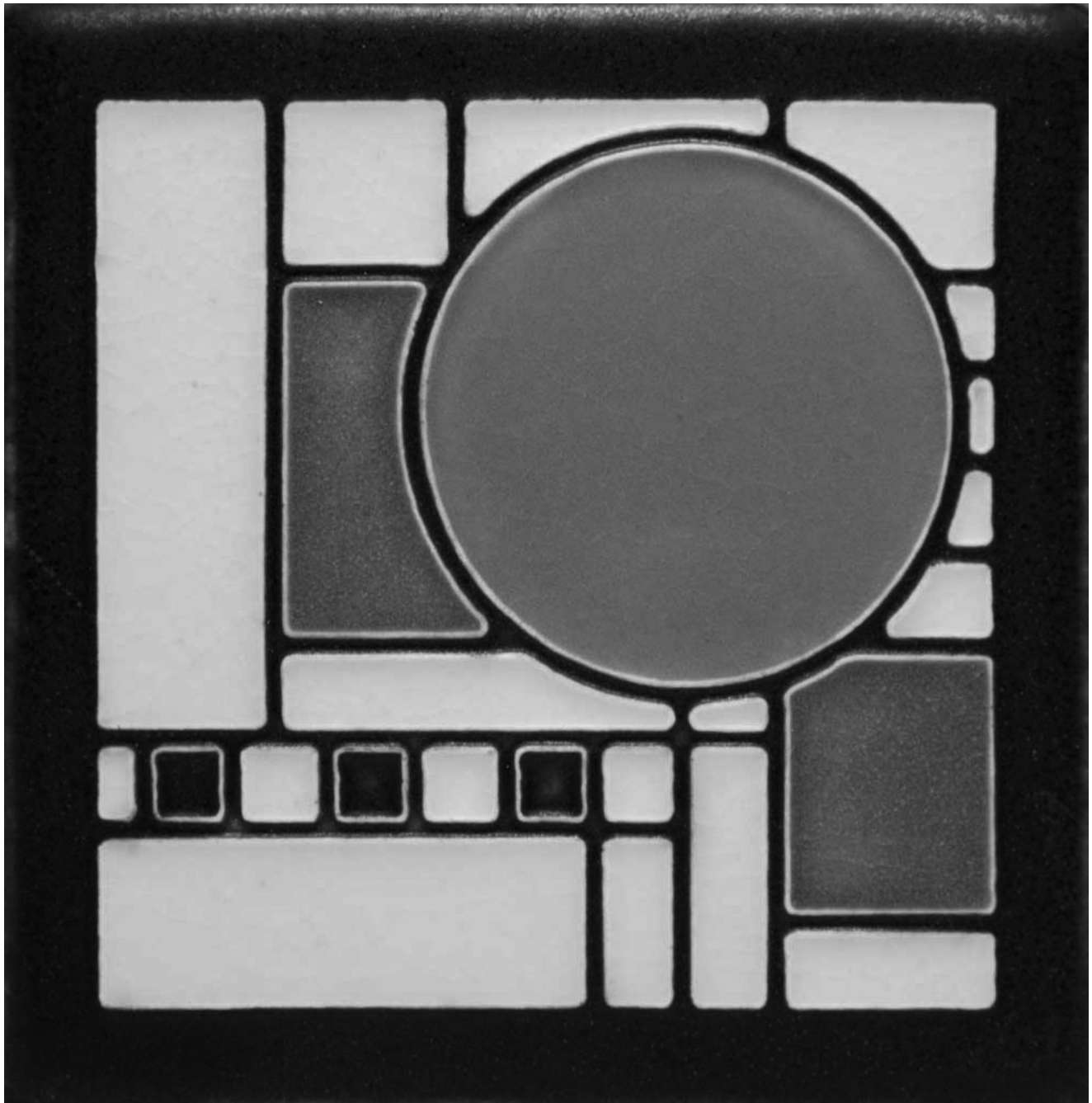

Materials:

- [Walnut Hollow® #29620 Basswood Canvas 8x8](#)
- [Walnut Hollow® #23906 Creative Versa-Tool™](#)
- [Walnut Hollow® #1095 Graphite Transfer Paper](#)
- Color Pencils
- Woodburning Pattern
- Other Supplies: fine sandpaper, foam brush, paper towel, pliers, ruler, spray varnish, stylus or pen, tape, wood sealer

Instructions:

1. To prepare wood for woodburning, use fine sandpaper to lightly sand to a smooth surface. Remove dust with paper towel.
2. Place pattern on Basswood Canvas. Secure with tape. Slide Transfer Paper under pattern, carbon side down. Use stylus or pen to trace lines. Use a ruler for the straight lines.
3. Before using the Creative Versa-Tool, read through and follow all safety precautions. Attach Universal Point on Tool. Tighten with pliers. Secure stand to hard surface with tape. Place Tool on stand. Switch "ON". Plug into electric outlet and heat for 4-5 minutes. (To make a new Universal Point easier to use, hold the Point on a slight angle and lightly drag each side over a piece of sandpaper a few times. It will take some of the sharpness away and will glide over the wood more easily.) Practice on a scrap of wood before beginning project to get a feel for the Tool. Use a light touch. Do not press hard, just let the Tool do the work and gently glide over the wood.
4. Use Universal Point to burn the traced lines. Use a ruler for the straight lines. Hold ruler on straight line and pull Point along edge. For curved lines, go slowly and try to stay on the lines. Fill in spaces between the narrow lines using the side of the tip. When narrow lines are complete, switch "OFF". Let cool and use pliers to remove Universal Point.
5. Attach Shading Point. Tighten with pliers. Switch "ON" and let heat for 4-5 minutes. Use Shading Point to burn wide edges. When complete, switch "OFF". Unplug tool and let cool.
6. Use foam brush to apply one coat of wood sealer to Basswood Canvas. Let dry. Use fine sandpaper to lightly sand to a smooth finish. A piece of brown paper bag will also work as sandpaper.
7. Apply Oil Colored Pencil to specific areas as desired or shown in photo.
8. Apply 2-3 coats of spray varnish for a protective finish. Let dry between coats. Lightly sand with fine sandpaper or paper bag between coats.
